

Regulation for the admission of foreign citizens to the "1 Decembrie 1918" University of Alba Iulia in the 2026-2027 academic year**Preparatory Year of Romanian Language**

Admission to university studies, including for the preparatory year of Romanian language, is based on the following admission criteria:

- a. The admission average calculated as the weighted average between:
 1. The average obtained at the graduation exam that allows the candidate access to university studies in the cycle for which he/she is applying (30%);
 2. The grade obtained in the motivational interview test, based on a letter of intent (70%).
- b. the candidates' option mentioned in the online registration form;

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- a. For candidates who are foreign nationals from third countries (non-EU), the average obtained at the graduation exam that confers the right to access the cycle of studies for which they apply represents 30% of the final admission average. The average is taken from the diploma or equivalent official documents and is calculated on the basis of the recognized grading system, with conversion to the national grading system, where applicable, according to the regulations in force.
- b. For candidates who are foreign nationals from third countries (non-EU), the motivational interview test, carried out on the basis of the letter of intent, has a weight of 70% of the final admission average and is evaluated based on the following criteria:

1. Motivation for choosing the study program – 20%

The clarity, coherence and consistency of the arguments regarding the choice of field and study program are evaluated, as well as their concordance with the candidate's previous educational path.

2. Adequacy of academic and professional goals – 15%

The extent to which the stated objectives are realistic, well-defined and relevant to the cycle of studies for which they are applying is analysed.

3. Knowledge of the field of study – 15%

The level of familiarity with the chosen field, the ability to formulate pertinent ideas and to demonstrate a genuine interest in the respective academic area is appreciated.

4. Ability to express and argue – 10%

The coherence of the discourse, the ability to structure ideas, to answer questions adequately and to support the points of view expressed in the cover letter are evaluated.

5. Academic and motivational maturity – 10%

The degree of intellectual autonomy, responsibility for the academic path and availability for active involvement in the educational process are pursued.

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Business Administration in English - Bachelor's Degree

SELECTION CRITERIA:

1. **Genuine motivation** – clear and sincere reasons for the scholarship.
2. **Letter-interview coherence** – consistency of ideas and values.
3. **Academic performance** – results and intellectual potential.
4. **Clear goals** – realistic short- and long-term plans.
5. **Experience and involvement** – relevant activities and demonstrated impact.
6. **Values and ethics** – integrity and social responsibility.
7. **Communication** – clear and reasoned expression.
8. **Self-knowledge** – reflection on strengths and limits.
9. **Potential impact** – contribution to the university community.
10. **Attitude** – professionalism, balance and management of emotions.

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Computer Science in English - Bachelor's Degree

Admission to university studies, including for the preparatory year of Romanian language, is based on the following admission criteria:

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b. the candidates' option mentioned in the online registration form;

SELECTION CRITERIA:

The test consists of the presentation and argumentation of the Letter of Intent submitted by the candidate. During the interview, the following components are evaluated, according to the established weights:

1. Motivation and personal goals – 30%

The following are assessed:

- a) clarity of reasons for choosing the field of Computer Science;
- b) the consistency of the arguments presented in the cover letter;
- c) maturity and realism of the personal development plan.

2. Compatibility with the program – 30%

The following are assessed:

- a) justification for choosing the program with teaching in English;
- b) level of understanding of the content and academic requirements specific to the program;
- c) aligning the candidate's interests with the specialization profile.

3. Involvement and relevant experiences in the field – 20%

The following are assessed:

- a) participating in STEM activities, projects, competitions or courses;
- b) experiences demonstrating interest and initiative in IT, programming, robotics, applied mathematics, etc.;

4. Transversal skills and maturity – 10%

The following are assessed:

- a) communication skills (clarity, coherence, structure) and the candidate's behavior and attitude during the interview.
